# V. INVITATIONS (Art. 107-110, 120, 250, 251.1, 420, 423, 444, YR3, J3; also see Categories of Events, Dressage Rules; Art. 484 of the Rules for FEI World Cup<sup>™</sup> Dressage))

- 1. <u>In the CDI competitions No. 1-5</u> the following competitors are authorized to participate; with horses of 7 years and over in competition 1 and 2 and horses of 8 years and over in competition 3 5:
  - Invited Nations: AUS, AUT, DEN, FRA, GBR, NED, SWE, USA, Reserve Nation: SUI; each of this NF may send 2 riders to the event. The NFs may decide, which riders to send.
  - German riders belonging to the Championship cadre or B cadre Dressage or are nominated by the federal trainer Dressage in agreement with the OC;
  - 2 riders on personal invitation of the OC.
  - the FEI has the right to nominate 1 rider
  - Each competitor may bring along two horses for competition no. 1 and 2 and two more horses for competition no. 3 to 5 which have to be started acc. to the schedule.
- The following competitors are authorized to participate in the CSI competitions No. 6-11 with horses of 7 years and over and in No. 12 and 13 with 7 or 8 years old horses:
  - Approx. 25 foreign riders who will be invited through their home NF. Invited Nations: AUT, BEL, BRA, DEN, ESP, FRA, GBR, IRL, JPN, NED, SUI, SWE, UKR, USA. The competitors must be selected from the top 250 on the FEI/Gandini World Jumping Riders' Rakings No. 74; 6 competitors may be invited not being selected from the top 250 on the FEI/Gandini World Jumping Riders' Rankings No. 74
  - Competitors, taking part in the Qualifying Competitions for the Olympic Games 2008, provided they receive a starting permit from the FEI.
  - The FEI has the right to nominate two riders.
  - In addition, 15 % of all foreign CSI competitors may receive a personal invitation (wildcard) from the OC through their NFs.
  - Approx. 25 German riders either nominated by the federal trainer jumping or personally invited by the organizer to the following ration: per 4 riders nominated by the federal trainer jumping one rider can be personally invited by the organizer.
  - 2 The Juniors/Young Riders who have been nominated by the federal trainer jumping.
  - The share of foreign and German competitors must be between 50 and 60 % each.

Each competitor may bring along three horses for competitions 6 - 11 and two more horses for competitions 12 and 13, which have to be started acc. to the schedules.

#### 3. In the Qualifying Competitions for the Olympic Games 2008 Nor. 14 and 15

Open to competitors of the FEI Qualifying Group G (except CHN and HKG) on invitation of the FEI. Each NF may send one or two individual riders or a team with max. 4 competitors.



4. In the International S M L - Tour / CSI Amateurs No. 16 - 24 the following riders may participate

 approx. 10 foreign riders who will be invited by the organizer through their home NF

· approx. 20 German riders who will be invited by the organizer

The following applies to all competitors:

- Per rider 3 horses, however per competition only two horses permitted, which are not started in competitions 1 to 15.
- Admitted are only riders who do not make a living (neither fully nor partly) from riding, dealing, training of horses and/or riders with own horses or horses belonging to other family members. The buying and selling of horses as well as receiving prize money in cash are not forbidden, providing they so not constitute the competitor's only source of income.
  Holding the "Amateur Owner" status, does not bar competitors from taking the provide the competition of the provide the competition.
- Holding the "Amateur Owner" status, does not bar competitors from taking part in other competitions or Championships. As long as the competitor holds the "Amateur Owner" status, he/she will not be allowed to take part in international or national initial competitions with a height of 1.50 m or greater. The Amateur Owner licence will be issued by the riders' respective NF and has to be applied for by the rider in due time before the begin of the event.
- Amateur-Owner competitors need an "Amateur-Owner licence" of their home NF and has to be applied for in due time before the begin of the event.

# VII. FACILITIES OFFERED (Art. 132, 133)

### A. Competitors

Accommodation requests may be done through the organizer, at the latest when handing in the definitive entries. All hotel expenses will be at the competitors' own expense.

### **B. Grooms**

Accommodation request for grooms: see A. Competitors. Sites for caravans with current supply can be made available against a fee of EUR 60.00 and have to be ordered when handing in the entries. Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the OC. The grooms will get free meals from 7<sup>th</sup> June (evening) to 10<sup>th</sup> June, 2007 (noon).



## C. Horses

The horses of the competitors acc. to V. (Invitations) will be stabled in boxes, first bedding included.

Further forage and bedding will be at the competitors' own expense. Both can be purchased at the prices of the day against payment in the show office.

The required boxes (incl. tack box) have to be ordered when handing in the nominated entries. The fee for boxes are included in the entry fee (lump-sum). For each tack box a fee of EUR 120.00 will be charged, unless the order has been withdrawn in writing (Fax/E-Mail) by 25<sup>th</sup> May, 2007. Boxes will be available from Wednesday, 6<sup>th</sup> June, 2007 (evening) to Sunday, 10<sup>th</sup> June, 2007 (evening).

There will be no reimbursement of transport charges and the organizer will not take over any fees for customs and veterinary formalities. Size of boxes: 3 x 3 m

### D. Welcome

The time and date of arrival of riders and horses and their means of transport must be given to the organiser in order to facilitate them on arrival.

### E. Shuttle Service

Shuttle Service for competitors from the hotel to the show ground will be available.

### F. Advertising and Publicity on Competitors and Horses

The competitors are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor in accordance with Art. 136.1-2.

The chief steward is responsible for ensuring that FEI Regulations relating to Art. 136 are respected by the riders before entering the arena. Competitors not complying with Art. 136 will not be permitted into the arena during the competition.

## 2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

At the time of the first horse examination, i. e. on arrival of the horses on the show venue and before entering the stables, every competitor is obliged to have on hand the health certificates which are required for the transport to the event:

- a) if the competitor comes from an EU member country, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of annex B of the directive 90/426 EEC in the currently valid issue (see attached specimen)
- b) if the competitor comes from a third country, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of annex II of the decision of the Commission 92/260 in the currently valid issue.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The competitor must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents. Besides, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CON-TROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 21<sup>st</sup> Edition, effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2005, revision 2006:



#### <u>Art. 139.1</u>

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 141.2), and all horses entered for other Cls, ClOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 141.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

#### <u>Art. 139.2</u>

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII (except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

#### SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3\*/4\*, CSIs (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

#### MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

# X. MISCELLANEOUS

### **1.PROTESTS** (Art. 167)

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

### 2. DISTRIBUTION OF PRIZES AND INDEMNITIES

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 130.2 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts. The total amount of prize money shown for each competition in the schedule must be distributed. If fewer competitors take part in a competition than the number of prizes indicated in the schedule, the President of the Ground Jury is responsible for recalculating the prize money to be distributed.

sponsible for recalculating the prize money to be distributed. Per competition 25 % of the competitors receive prize-money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize-money, however at least 5 competitors will receive a prize.

If riders have to be placed equally, the money value of the prizes in kind (e. g. a car) is divided accordingly. Settlement will be done per competitor. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each competitor binds himself, to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the competitor. Acc. to § 50a Abs. 4 this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 10 % up to 500 EUR, 15 % up to 1,000 EUR, 20 % exceeding 1,000 EUR; plus 5,5 % solidarity fee of the income tax. The tax deduction has to be confirmed on demand. Those foreign competitors being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every competitor himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

### **3.INSURANCES**

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.



## 4. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, competitors, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. He also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

**5. DOCTOR, FARRIER** Doctor and farrier will be present at the event, all services will be at the competitors' own expense.

6. EVENT'S ORGANISATION (Art. 114 - 115) In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping or Dressage Department by the Foreign Judge.

### 7. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS (Art. 133, 1005)

The following persons will receive free entry bands: the competitors and per competitor one accompanying person, one Chef d'équipe + Team veterinarian per group G team and one groom as well as up to two owners per horse (acc. to the FEI passport), provided the show office has been given the names before the event begins.

### 8. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Riders wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These riders will start first in these competitions.

### 9. SAFETY CUPS

# THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

### FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

# 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
